ROHINGYA RELIEF WORK

On June 12, 2021, at around 11:00 pm, there was a huge fire mishap reported at the Rohingya Settlement at Kanchan Kunj. The settlement, situated primarily on the land of the UP Irrigation Department was already under huge pressure from the administration for eviction. For the past couple of months, immense pressure was being built by the UP Administration to remove the settlement. Officials visiting the area and threatening these refugees with dire consequences had become a regular routine there.

Under these circumstances, a fire started at one of the vacant houses and soon engulfed the entire settlement. Miles2Smile Foundation was one among the various NGOs and Good Samaritan groups that reached the place while fire tenders were still trying to extinguish the fire. We immediately moved these people to a safer location and arranged for drinking water and first aid. For the night, we managed plastic sheets so that they can rest with their family. From the next morning, we started mobilizing relief materials from our resource centres in North East Delhi.

We collected used and new clothes from a number of NGOs and individuals and segregated them as per different age and gender groups. By the next morning, we were able to provide clothes to almost all the families. The next big task was to ensure a roof over every head and with the help of the SDM, tents were placed at an adjacent area. Soon, we were able to provide fans, folding beds, bed sheets, utensils, dry ration and other essential household items to all. The fire caused distress to a lot of innocent individuals, their happiness seemed lost but by the grace of the almighty, we were able to restore those precious smiles.

MOSQUE IN INDIAN CAPITAL'S ROHINGYA CAMP BULLDOZED: REFUGEES

Rohingya living in a camp at New Delhi's Madanpur Khader area accuse authorities of demolishing the makeshift mosque.

Police and civil authorities in the Indian capital have demolished a makeshift mosque in a Rohingya camp, say the refugees, weeks after a massive fire had engulfed the settlement. The mosque made up of tarpaulin sheets and bamboo sticks were bulldozed at about 7 am local time (01:30 GMT) on Thursday, at the camp located in New Delhi's Madanpur Khader area in the city's south, bordering Uttar Pradesh state.

Activist Aasif Mujtaba, whose group Miles to Smile assists the Rohingya and collaborates with the government in their rehabilitation, said officials had been alleging that the camp, including the mosque, stood on encroached land.

INDIA: FIRE RIPS THROUGH ROHINGYA CAMP, LEAVING HUNDREDS HOMELESS

Hundreds of Rohingya rendered homeless after a massive fire razes Rohingya camp in the Madanpur Khadar area of Delhi.

A massive fire has destroyed a Rohingya refugee camp in the Indian capital, New Delhi, leaving hundreds of people homeless. The fire service department of the national capital said that it put 15 fire tenders into service and brought the blaze under control in about six hours. "We rushed to the spot quickly and started dousing the flames," Sandeep, an operator at the Delhi Fire Service, told Al Jazeera by telephone on Sunday.

Asif Mujtaba, a Delhi-based activist, told Al Jazeera that his group was one of the first to provide relief as soon as the flames were doused. "We shifted those who needed medical attention to nearby hospitals, and arranged water and food for the refugees," Mujtaba said, adding that he was reaching out to officials to help set up an interim relief camp for them, in the scorching summer heat. "We are also mapping out details of the families who suffered losses in the fire," he said.

INDIA CONTRADICTS ITS OWN CONSTITUTIONAL 'RIGHT TO LIVE' BY DEPRIVING BASIC RIGHTS FOR MUSLIM ROHINGYA REFUGEES

The exodus of Rohingya Muslims from Myanmar has been filled by exceeding violence. With a proportion of the community now seeking refuge in India, the marginalised community now faces double discrimination, as both a refugee and a Muslim in BJP India

On June 12, Mohammad Saleem, a Rohingya refugee, living in the Kalindi Kunj area of South Delhi, was forced to evacuate the refugee camp as a massive fire broke out in the dead of night. As a result of the fire, 56 homes were gutted, leaving nearly 300 people screaming desperately on the streets without a home to go to.

Asif Mustafa, a research scholar, runs an NGO to provide support to the victims of this catastrophe. He has taken an active part in organising logistics and health management for these people. "From the day of fire: June 12, we have been helping the victims," Asif tells The New Arab. In the fires, Rohingyas lost all their assets. So the help was to be provided in terms of food, shelter and basic healthcare. Asif teamed up with the local administrations and other NGO's to set up tents and supply food items.


